



Crime and Patrol Situation Under Review

While Old Braeswood has a low rate of crime as compared to much of the city, its location at the nexus of thoroughfares leading the country's largest Medical Center, leaves the neighborhood vulnerable to crimes of opportunity. There was a mild spike in crime this spring, but the past month has gone by without incident. The need for a patrol was recognized many years ago, and the formation of RACS was a good solution for the past couple of decades. But recently, RACS participation has declined, and as a result coverage has suffered. It is essential that we remain vigilant and communicate when we see suspicious activity, keep our porch lights on at night, set our alarms every time we leave the house, report street light outages to Centerpoint, look out for neighbor's homes when they are out of town, and refuse to open doors to solicitors and scam artists. Cell phones with cameras are a great tool for reporting crime and taking photographs of suspicious vehicles. Please use yours often! The Old Braeswood Board is in the process of evaluating security issues overall and is researching options. We look forward to sending you a report on this effort in August.

Old Braeswood Street Reconstruction On Hold For Now by Evalyn L. Krudy

Over the past few years many of you participated in Old Braeswood's petition drive to collect signatures to qualify our aging streets for reconstruction under the city's Neighborhood Street Reconstruction Program (NSRP). The bad news is that the blocks that had submitted petitions for full reconstruction and infrastructure replacement, including drainage, have lost their place in line due to a recent decision by city leaders.

As you may know, voters passed the Rebuild Houston initiative as a way to fund drainage and infrastructure improvements without having to issue debt. Rebuild Houston is a needs based system. According to Dale Rudick, Director of Rebuild Houston, roads in the inner city have been assessed to determine quality and drainage problems. The City now knows where the worst problems are and plans to address these areas first as funds are available. This system is (pardon the pun) groundbreaking, and Mr. Rudick expects other cities will adopt this equitable and fair process for replacing aging infrastructure.

The good news for Old Braeswood is that blocks that submitted petitions through last year will be given priority over other areas. For instance, roads in the Southgate and Morningside Place neighborhoods north of Holcombe were built about the same time and are in similar condition to roads in Old Braeswood. But because they did not submit NSR petitions, Old Braeswood's roads should be rebuilt first. At least, this is how the program is expected to work at this juncture. Just when the City will get around to rebuilding our streets is anyone's guess, but we can definitely expect to be waiting 10 or more years -- which is exactly where we were in line under the NSR program. The recent overlay should last 7-10 years or more, so most of the neighborhood is in better shape than many other parts of Houston.

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A house can be many different things besides a home. Sometimes it's an art gallery. Artist Dee Murray lives with her husband, Bill, at 2402 Maroneal, where they host many Old Braeswood gatherings. Dee is a past President of the OB Property Owner's Association. They hosted both the POA meeting in April and the OB Garden Club meeting in May. Every event in their home is a de facto art show, because Dee's work is everywhere.

Dee's story is that of a woman who is familiar with change. After marriage and four children, she went to graduate school in social work. Then, after a long career focusing on the treatment of substance abuse, she retired as vice-president

of the Houston Council on Alcohol and Drugs. (She still sits on the National Board of Cenikor, a substance abuse program.) She retired to study art. Up to that point, she had made her own Christmas cards and "fiddled with art," but never taken a class.

Training at the Glassell School, and with various local artists, prepared Dee to produce work in a variety of mediums.

She paints in a studio that was once a spare bedroom. Currently, her art sells at Loop, a Houston boutique, and at The Tyler County Art League, in Woodville. She also sells privately upon request, and her handmade greeting cards are very popular.

Bill, an international business consultant and owner of W.J. Murray & Associates, came to Houston with Dee from New York and settled in Southgate. They liked the neighborhood, but moved to OB in 1999 specifically to change from a two-story house to a one-story. The mid-century house on Maroneal was just right.

The Maroneal house served several other families before the Murrays. It first appears in the Houston City Directory in 1956, when it was purchased by Helen and Henry B. Desenberg. Henry was a founder and part owner of Beard & Stone Electric Company, a Houston-based auto

parts distributor. The house from which the Desenbergs moved was also in OB, the one at 7319 Greenbriar (*Old Braeswood News* July/August 2011). Within two years of the Desenbergs' move, Henry's company merged with Michigan Plating to become Gulf & Western Corporation. As a romantic aside, although the Desenbergs were both Texas born, they met and married as students at the University of Michigan.

The Desenbergs sold the house to Doris and Tom S. Loomis, Jr. in 1970. Tom was owner of Loomis Telephone Answering Service. He was an officer in many state and national professional associations related to his business, and

in 1992, was selected for the National Telephone Telecommunications Hall of Fame.

The last owner before Dee and Bill was Garry Leon Plotkin, who bought the house in 1991, and lived there alone. Garry was a Director on the Board of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, and part of various winning consortiums that bid on livestock. [\$64,000 for a goat in 2006; \$80,000 for a lamb and \$55,000 for a turkey in 2004; \$375,000 for a steer and \$62,000 for a turkey in 2003; \$130,000

for a pen of broilers in 2001; \$85,000 for a pencil drawing of a cowboy in 1999; \$101,000 for a color drawing in 1998; \$30,000 for a pen of broilers in 1997; and \$35,000 for a turkey in 1996.]

Garry had a phone line at his bedside that gave direct access to Rodeo offices, and often it was used by Rodeo staff to provide airport arrival times of dignitaries that Garry was to meet and greet. He also was known for his work as a Director of the 100 Club, benefitting Houston police officers.

At the last POA gathering, this house, complete with its history and with Dee's art, was a setting that accentuated the topic of the guest speaker – the current popularity and marketability of mid-century housing.




Dee and Bill Murray's home at 2402 Maroneal is an excellent example of an updated mid century modern home.
