Crime on the rise in OB after eight month hiatus

2011 was one of the most crime-filled years on record for Old Braeswood. HPD crime statistics show 12 burglaries and 2 auto thefts between January 1 and December 31. Crime was most intense last summer. No burglaries were reported between October 1, 2011 and February 20, 2012. Since February 21st there have been three burglaries and one attempted burglary reported to HPD.

If you have been the victim of a crime, please be sure to report the crime to HPD, as this agency maintains crime statistics. Also, RACS Patrol does not notify us about crime, so please tell us if you have been a victim. This will allow us to work with our


local HPD detectives to ensure neighborhood crime is being addressed. Residents have recently reported several suspicious persons at their doors and peering in their windows, plus a large number of magazine (scam) salesmen.

Crimes so far this year include the February 2nd robbery of Co-America Bank on Holcombe & Morningside and the following incidents:

Feb. 21 burglary - 2300 block of Blue Bonnet; March 8 burglary - 2500 block of Maroneal; March 10 burglary— Morningside; and an attempted burglary on the same date in the 2500 block of Bellefontaine.

Please be alert for suspicious activity and notify the RACS Patrol at 713-755-7628 if you see anything out of the ordinary.

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Newcomers to Old Braeswood have a surprise awaiting them when it comes time to vote. Other people vote in public places like schools and grocery stores. We vote in our neighbors' garages. In fact, we vote in two specific garages, sometimes in Ann Garnett's garage at 2337 Gramercy Blvd. (the Republican garage), sometimes in Joanne Brodsky's garage at 2347 Underwood Blvd. (the Democratic garage). Why is that?

The answer requires some knowledge of how counties are divided politically. Each of the 254 counties in Texas is divided into election precincts. Each election precinct has an Election Precinct Chair for each of the two major political parties. In Old Braeswood, which is the 472 Precinct, Ann Garnett is the Republican Chair and Joanne Brodsky is the Democratic Chair. Their primary job as Precinct Chairs is to identify Party members living in the precinct and to encourage them to vote.

Ann assumed her duties in 2000, and Joann has served since 1982. Each of them was qualified in three important ways. They had an interest in the political process. They were members of the Parties they wanted to represent. And each had a generously sized garage for conducting elections out of the rain.

An election precinct also has an Election Judge from each of the two major Parties. In our precinct, our two Precinct Chairs also serve as our two Election Judges. (Now we're honing in on why we switch between garages!) There is a periodic review of the voting pattern in each precinct to determine which Party's Election Judge will be the presiding Election Judge for the next General Election. The other Party's Election Judge becomes the alternate Election Judge. Currently, Joanne is

the presiding Judge and Ann is the alternate. We vote in the garage of the presiding Election Judge.

The night before the General Election, both Election Judges meet to set up the voting machines and tables. All the voting machines - the individual voting machines that we use to vote and the two machines that they feed our recorded votes into are sealed before they are delivered to the OB garage. Early on Election Day, Ann and Joanne meet again to cut the seals on the machines and to open the polls. At the end of the day, they close the polls together. Then, they count all the signatures in the sign-in books and match that total to the total number of votes. The number of signatures must equal the number of votes.

Ann and Joanne each take away a tabulation of the number of votes received by each candidate (but not who cast those votes, it being a secret ballot!).

Ann presided over a General Election during her very first year as Election Judge. It was the year of George W. Bush's first Presidential run. She looked out early that morning and saw people lined up in her driveway and down the block, "many of them in scrubs, ready for work in the Med Center." They had to wait, because she wasn't allowed to open the polls until 7:00 am. The day was busy nonstop, unlike the day of a Primary, when there is time to chat with voters who pull up a chair and linger after casting their ballot. Ann found herself giving interviews in her driveway to the press and even to a television reporter. Polling in unusual places is a favorite media topic and an OB garage is an "unusual place."

Joanne recalls that she raised her children at the polls. She used to put two or three playpens on her driveway for her own young children and for those of the voters. "I'm a nurse, so I kept them clean." The playpens also came in handy during the Democratic Party precinct meetings in her driveway after the polls closed. "We discussed the important issues of the day while keeping an eye on the babies. " (Not surprisingly, after their early exposure to politics, her three children each served as an intern in Washington D.C.)

Unlike the rancor and incivility that we witness in the media among politicians, there is no ill will between our OB political party representatives. Ann and Joanne share a warm friendship and enjoy working together.
